Technique IS Music: A Master's Workshop

Grigory Kalinovsky, one of today's most sought-after violin pedagogues, is welcoming us to his studio for a fascinating session.

Kalinovsky is professor of music in violin at the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, where he was appointed to faculty in fall 2013. He also teaches at the IU Summer String Academy and continues to teach at the Heifetz International Music Institute.

ViolinMind, his book on theory and technique of playing using different tuning systems was published by OvationPress in 2019.

Kalinovsky has presented master classes at many major U.S. festivals and music schools, including New England Conservatory, Colburn School, Meadowmount, University of Maryland, San Francisco Conservatory, and Seattle Conservatory. He has also presented at numerous European and Asian institutions, such as the Sibelius Academy in Helsinki, Buchmann-Mehta School of Music and Jerusalem Music Center in Israel, Hochschule für Musik "Hanns Eisler" in Germany, Beijing Central Conservatory in China, and Seoul National University and Korea National University of Arts in Seoul.

Kalinovsky's students have won top prizes at national and international competitions, including the Tibor Varga Youth Competition, Menuhin Young Artists Competition in England, Andrea Postacchini Young Violinists Competition in Italy, and Fischoff International Chamber Music Competition in Chicago. They have gone on to study at institutions such as Curtis, Colburn, Juilliard, Yale, New England Conservatory, Manhattan School of Music, and Indiana University, among others.



One of the greatest American violin soloists, recording artists and educators, Emmy Award-winning violinist **Robert McDuffie** shares his experience and knowledge with most talented students from the Chicago area.

McDuffie is known for his award-winning recordings and appearances with the world's leading orchestras. He is the founder of Robert McDuffie Center for Strings at Mercer University and the artistic director of Rome Chamber Music Festival.

A multifaceted musicans, McDuffie has also shared the stage with eclectic musicians such as R.E.M. bassist Mike Mills and Rolling Stones pianist Chuck Leavell. Philip Glass dedicated his Violin Concerto No. 2, The American Four Seasons to Mr. McDuffie and he has performed it more than 100 times around the world.

Mr. McDuffie has a wide-ranging discography and his recent release, Icons, with pianist Elizabeth Pridgen, features sonatas of Philip Glass and John Corigliano as well as John Adams' Road Movies. His acclaimed Telarc, Orange Mountain, and EMI recordings include the violin concertos of Mendelssohn, Bruch, Adams, Glass, Mills, Barber, Rózsa, Bernstein, William Schuman, and Viennese violin favorites.

He has been profiled on NBC's Today, CBS's Sunday Morning, and in The New York Times and The Wall Street Journal.
